

St. Baldrick's Foundation-Finding a Cure for Kids with Cancer

When Chris was a freshman at CC, his lacrosse team had a fundraiser for St. Baldrick's, a charity that funds the most promising research



to help find a cure for kids with cancer. Team members shaved their heads as a way of showing their support of kids going through treatment and received donations for shaving their head. When I said that it was a nice thing for him to do, Chris said, "Ma, it was the least I could do for these

kids." We donated to St. Baldrick's in honor of Chris and his CC lacrosse teammate, Evan Spirito, who lost his brave three year battle to cancer this past fall.

University of Vermont's Catamount Classic- "Lacrosse for a Cure"

UVM lacrosse player, Zack Telander, is a Lake Forest alumni - and also wears the same number that Chris did in college --#21! The CQF made a donation to the UVM team fundraiser the Catamount Classic - "Lacrosse for a Cure." Proceeds from this event were donated to the Dana Farber Cancer Institute's cam-

paign to educate college students about the importance of cancer screening and cancer awareness prevention. One of the UVM teammates had been diagnosed with cancer and - due to early detection - is thankfully now in remission. The team is now helping others.

In 6th grade, Chris tried out for the school basketball team but was cut from the team! After a few tears, Chris decided not to quit basketball, but to work on becoming a better player. He played on a Highwood Small Fry team - playing teams from all over Chicago and was exposed to a diversity you don't see in Lake Forest. We were so

happy to donate to "847 Hoops" developed by Chris' basketball/soccer teammate, Aron Khurana and LFHS coach, Darren Barndt.

Over forty 7th-8th grade campers attended a week-long summer camp with high level coaching for FREE. Goals were twofold: 1) provide an opportunity for kids to attend a camp they couldn't afford and 2) bring kids of different cultural, socio-economic backgrounds together.

"Soccer For Success" Inner City Program Illinois Youth Soccer Association's -

For many years, Chris participated in IYSA's ODP program where he made new friends from diverse cultural and economic backgrounds - many who came from underserved communities. These friendships helped him grow as a soccer player and more importantly, as a person. We donated to IYSA's "Soccer for Success." Over 250 children from Chicago's underserved urban communities participated for FREE in a 12-week sports-based development program to empower children to lead a

healthy lifestyle (over 49% of the children were overweight), value education and increase their life skills.

First Tee of Chicago - "Teaching Life Lessons On & Off the Links"

Chris loved playing golf! Pat - a LF soccer teammate- and Pat's dad, Jim (who spent years as their youth soccer coach) would often take Chris to some of the best golf courses in Chicago! We were so sad to lose Jim unexpectedly last fall. I am grateful to have spoken to Jim not too long before that. I will never forget him sharing with me that he had

Mothers Trust Foundation (MTF)

The MTF aids children in need in Illinois. Requests for help come from social workers and school counselors who work with children whose needs have fallen through the cracks. Although not usually life threatening, each issue is an emergency to the child and as a result, MTF is often their only hope. The CQF has

partnered with MTF to provide funds to help youth in the areas of sports, travel and music - three of Chris' passions. This year we were able to help many including: covering the fees for a 6-year old to participate in his park basketball program; paying for a straight "A" student to

attend a Skills USA Leadership Development Conference; and helping a homeless 13-year-old pay for his 8th grade class trip to Washington, D.C.

Through the loving donations of friends and family, the Christopher Quon Foundation (CQF) was established to honor Chris who unexpectedly lost his life at the age of 22 in 2009. A graduate of Lake Forest High School (2005) and Colorado College (2009), Chris had just begun his career as a financial analyst at Duff & Phelps in Chicago. His parents, Diane and David, and his sisters, Sarah, Rachel and Kasey, are committed to honoring Chris by using the funds to support all that he loved and cared about so deeply.

A varsity athlete in high school and college in both soccer and lacrosse, Chris used his sports whenever he could to help or show his support for others less fortunate than him. Fighting cancer was a particular passion for him as both of his grandfathers had lived with cancer. We continue to support organizations that are committed to fighting cancer.

Chris also enjoyed working with youth in sports and helped coach LFHS teams during the summer. We have supported programs, therefore, that use sports to help young people develop on and off the field.

We know that Chris also wanted to help disadvantaged youth whenever possible. Through many organizations we have been able to provide grants to help young people in need in the area of sports, music and travel--three of Chris' passions.

Finally, Chris loved his time as a student and athlete at both LFHS and CC. Both schools have also been so kind in helping us honor Chris in many ways. We wanted to also honor Chris, therefore, by giving back to his alma maters.
